How are you using AI? For example...

1. Editing reports & letters

2. Drafting annual reviews

3. Summarising meeting notes

4. Proofreading & tone checks



Al is... a pattern-recognition tool that predicts words to generate text.

It can draft, simplify, and check communications

– but it is not magic.

Key Al terms you'll hear today

LLM - Large language model, trained on huge amounts of data.

Prompt - The instruction or question you give the Al.

Hallucination - When AI makes something up but sounds convincing.

Context window - How much the AI can "remember" in one go.

Automation – Using AI to take on repetitive tasks so you can focus on higher-value, strategic work.

Use AI responsibly:

- 1. Never input client data into public tools!
- 2. Turn data training off before you start
- 3. Always apply human review
- 4. Follow firm wording and compliance rules

Risks:



- Hallucinations
- Compliance wording
- Over-simplification
- Data security



A strong prompt has 3 parts:

- 1. Role
- 2. Client context
- 3. Task, constraints, tone



Bad vs Good Prompt

WEAK

"Write a client letter to XX about their pension"

Weak: Too vague, no role or contextSummarise these meeting notes" "You are a paraplanner preparing a draft client letter on behalf of a financial planner... take technical financial details and turn them into a client-friendly summary that is accurate, and easy to understand."

Stronger: Role + context + clear task

Fantastic Prompt Example



You are a paraplanner preparing a draft client letter on behalf of a financial planner.



Your role is to take technical financial details and turn them into a clear, client-friendly summary that is accurate, supportive, and easy to understand.



Heather, 55, employed, two pensions, retiring at 65, worried about income.

Task:

Draft clear, supportive letter (max 350 words), explain options, reassure.

Constraints:

Short paragraphs, no jargon, alternatives for 'defined benefit pension.

Role

Use the 3 steps below to write one clear prompt



• Be ready to share your best idea





Give Al a role (e.g. "You are a paraplanner...")



Add context (what and why is this task important?)



Define the task (what to do, tone, length, constraints)

Key takeaways:

- 1. Learn the key terms
- 2. Start small: proofread, simplify, summarise
- 3. Use adaptable prompt templates
